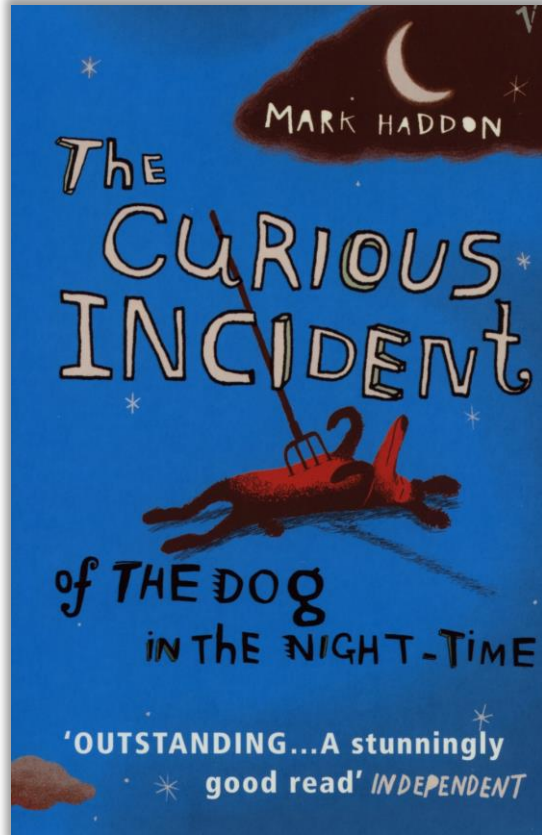








The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night-Time

- He has never gone further than the end of the road on his own, but when he finds a neighbour's dog murdered he sets out on a terrifying journey which will turn his whole world upside down.

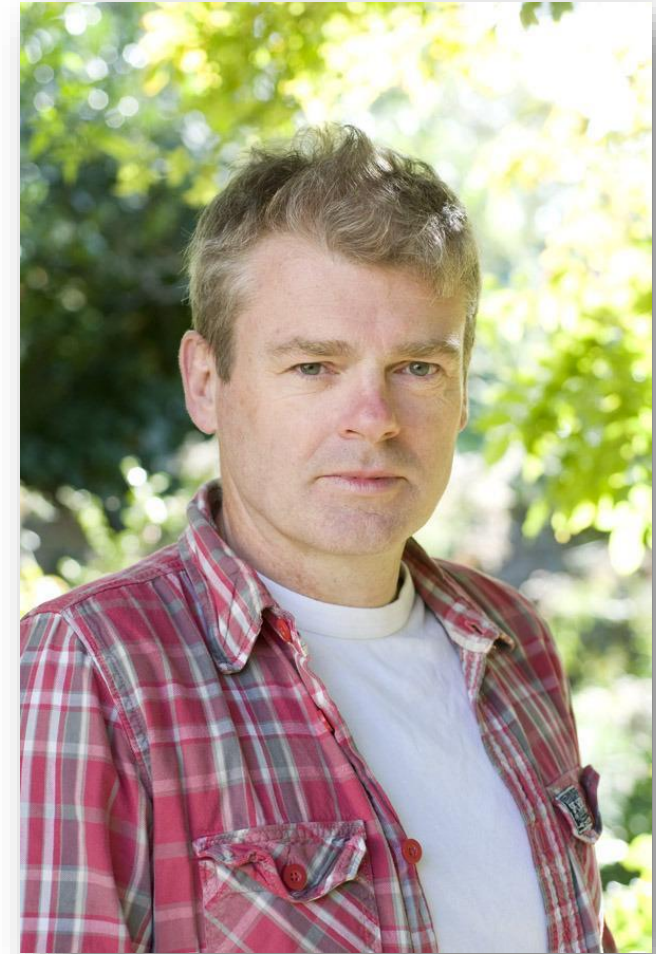

- **Did you know?** He has also written screenplays for BBC TV dramas.

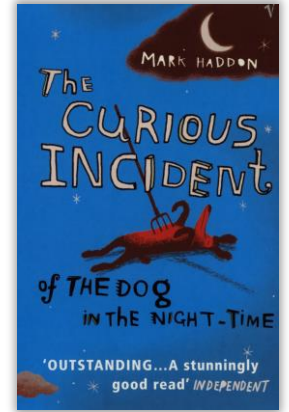


St Ives School Tutor Reading: Routine

- Ready – arrive promptly and settle quickly at the start of the session
- Respectful – listen, in silence, to their tutor and visiting adults reading
- Safe – follow instructions from staff, first time every time, including tracking the text with their reading ruler, and sitting with good posture
